**EFFECTIVE DATE:** January 1, 2006

**GOVERNOR’S BUDGET:** This bill is not anticipated by the Governor’s recommended budget.

**LOCAL GOVERNMENT MANDATE:** This bill does not affect local governments' service levels or shared revenues sufficient to trigger Section 15, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.

**COMMENTS:** Under current statute, an interagency coordinating council on hunger is established in the Housing and Community Services Department (HCSD), and the Hunger Relief Task Force in HCSD is the designated state entity on hunger. The measure would create the Ending Homelessness Advisory Council within HCSD, consisting of legislators, representatives from several state agencies, and local service providers, organizations, and businesses. Members of the advisory council would not be eligible for per diem or expense reimbursements. The responsibilities of the existing HCSD interagency coordinating council would be modified to include the issues regarding homelessness, creating an interagency coordinating council on hunger and homelessness.

State agency membership of the interagency coordinating council would expand to include representatives from the Employment Department, Department of Veterans’ Affairs, Department of Transportation, Oregon Youth Authority, Department of Community Colleges and Workforce Development, and Department of Justice. These agencies would each provide \$16,000 per biennium (General Fund or Other Funds), in addition to the nine current agencies, in order to fund work of the Ending Homelessness Advisory Council and Task Force on Hunger.
